Leo's Workshop completes one whole academic year cycle this month and what an awe-inspiring year of learning and teaching it has been. I am so incredibly proud to say that from the start to finish, we have stayed true to the vision of our school that states, "Leo's Workshop will enable and empower a community of self-directed learners who are compassionate, innovative and independent thinkers that will help shape their generation's role in the future of society."

As I reflect on the innovative learning experiences our students and teachers have co-designed and executed this year, I can't help but smile to myself. They have made such meaningful contributions to the world around them.

Inquirers, our 3-5 year olds have explored what emotions means and how we can express them using colours, designed scavenger hunts for their guests using maps and riddles, reduced, reused and recycled trashed to create art for spreading awareness about Pakistan's extinct animals, created Urdu board games, and now designing a playground for the butterflies and birds to transform our neighbourhood park into something useful for the community.

Builders, our 6-7 year olds are a bunch of very compassionate young people and all their projects' inquiry processes reflect that value. They spread awareness about the water scarcity issue in Pakistan, written letters to a Government official and had trash around the school cleaned up, created products to set up a Market place of their products to collect funds to donate to several causes they cared about, and ending the year with hosting a "Putli Tamasha" to bring their Urdu stories to life.

Thinkers, our 8-10 year olds have composed a very catchy Urdu Huroof Song, innovated toys that demonstrated energy transformation, planned a trip to the moon, as well as trips to other countries in the world, designed a Sci-Fi animal creature, wrote poetry for causes such as traffic problems, smoking, people fighting on the streets and worked on creating a cricket pitch in a neighbourhood park. And as All-School projects, our students have adopted an abandoned green patch in the neighbourhood and working on transforming it into a beautiful community garden. They have also created a school song, and most importantly, this magazine in itself is a product of their hardwork whilst they explored the driving question, "How can we create our own school magazine to tell the world about our school?"

As you navigate through this magazine, you'll see this magazine is a students' led product, facilitated by their loving teachers. The students have designed the pages in Canva, illustrated their school experiences and the cover page, created, edited and selected content for the magazine, conducted interviews all around the school and finally we just made a few tweaks for making it print-friendly.

So very proud of all the achievements of our school community. I can't wait to see what we have in store for our very innovative school of the future.


